
# Another Blooming Garden



we must all make every effort to reduce the amount of waste we produce. We can start by reducing our consumption of products and reusing them when-ever possible.



# Winter Tips

With winter just around the corner, we wanted to take the opportunity to provide you with some winter weather tips and reminders:

#### Snow Removal

- 1. We will remove the snow from most common sidewalks, parking lots and driveways. However, residents of garden homes and some townhomes are responsible for clearing their own walkways and steps. If you aren't sure whether or not the snow removal is your responsibility, please feel free to contact your Resident Services Centre to clarify.
- 2. When the snow falls please remember to move your car from the parking lot to allow the snow clearing vehicles to clear the parking spaces and lots. The more cars that are left in the lot, the harder

- it is and the longer it takes for the snow to get cleared.
- Please do not park on the side of the street during a heavy snow storm. The streets need to be clear of cars in order for the municipality to clear the streets.

We want everyone to stay safe and warm this winter - sometimes just walking outside can pose a hazard.

#### Safe Winter Walking:

- 1. Plan ahead; give yourself sufficient time and plan your route.
- 2. Wear shoes or boots that provide traction on snow and ice.
- 3. Use special care when entering and exiting vehicles.
- 4. Walk in designated walkways as much as possible.
